Online Library Services

Several databases are now available for use by library patrons, both in the library and remotely. These services have been provided by the Umatilla County Special Library District, and the Oregon State Library.

Tutor.com offers homework help, live everyday from 2-9 PM on various subject including math, science, social studies and English. The link is found on the library website (see below.) Simply log in, select the subject in which tutoring is desired, and connect with a qualified tutor.

Also available through a link on our website is *Learning Express*, a resource providing interactive practice for many professional and licensing tests for adults, and academic tests and skills for students. This website is helpful in building skills you might need for success in school, at work, or in life!

New to our library is Gale Cengage Learning database, which provides online full text access to thousands of magazines, newspapers, reference books, journal articles, and images.

Selected Statistics

Every year about this time, each public library in Oregon is required to submit a report to the State Library which covers a twelve month period. This report includes some numbers that you might find interesting. For example, our library offered 48 programs for children last year, and a dozen more were offered for adults. We circulated almost 6,000 items during the same time period, including books, audio books, periodicals, DVDs and music CDs. Other libraries borrowed our items through interlibrary loan 218 times, and our public access computer saw 350 uses.

The state of Oregon has been in second place in library circulation per capita for several years, with the state of Ohio holding the first place distinction. Oregonians make good use of our public libraries!
