

Rosetta Stone Available

Through our affiliation with the Umatilla County Special Library District, Weston Public Library is now offering the online language learning resource, *Rosetta Stone*.

Rosetta Stone provides cutting-edge interactive technology that is changing the way people learn to speak new languages. The company's techniques—acclaimed for their power to unlock the natural language-learning ability in everyone—are used by schools, businesses, government organizations and millions of individuals around the world.

Rosetta Stone offers courses in 30 languages, from the most commonly spoken (like English and Spanish) to the less prominent (including Swahili, Swedish and Tagalog.)

The company was founded in 1992 on the core beliefs that learning to

speak a language should be a natural and instinctive process, and that interactive technology can activate the language immersion method powerfully for learners of any age. In 2013, *Rosetta Stone* broadened its reach by acquiring the community-based language-learning company *Livemocha*.
