100 Years Ago in Weston

May 7, 1915

Everything is practically in readiness for the Pioneer's Reunion, which promises to be among the most successful and enjoyable ever held within the past 23 years

that have marked the annual gatherings of Umatilla County's old settlers at Weston. Direct illumination will be among this year's features. Through the efforts of Mayor Harbour, several strings of globes were secured for the

streets and pavilion, and free juice and wiring have been donated by the Preston-Shaffer milling company of Athena-whose kindness is appreciated. There will be free band concerts each evening at the pavilion.
