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## STEM Activity: Building Blocks

As the world becomes increasingly complex, our kids need to be equipped with knowledge and skills to solve problems and make sense of what they know. These are the skills kids learn when they study science, technology, engineering, and math—subjects known collectively as STEM. STEM activities offer hands-on and minds-on practice, making science and math fun.

Building with blocks is an example of a simple STEM activity that folks of all skill levels can enjoy. The Library has a set of KEVA Planks, purchased with a grant and obtained by Umatilla County Special Library District for all twelve libraries. These are perfectly cut, maple construction blocks that stack with stability, allowing a fun

building experience for kids and adults. The KEVA Planks are currently accessible in the library. Everyone is encouraged to stop in and experiment. We'll take a picture of your creation, and post it on our bulletin board.
